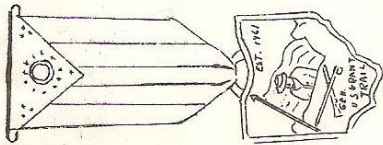

IN THE INTEREST OF
SCOUTING

WHO MAY QUALIFY:

Any registered Scout, Scouter or Explorer who holds at least the rank of SECOND CLASS or comparable rank in affiliate organizations.

UNIFORM:

Complete Scout or Explorer uniforms are required of all hikers and leaders who are qualifying for the U. S. GRANT TRAIL MEDAL. Uniforms may be appropriate for the season.

LEADERSHIP:

This trail will be a definite test of the unit leader's ability to control and guide his troop. Every unit must be accompanied by one or more adult leaders, who are responsible. It is suggested that all units have adequate insurance coverage.

CHURCH SERVICES:

If the trail is hiked on Sunday the trail is convenient to churches of the Protestant and Catholic faiths in Bethel, Ohio

TOUR PERMIT:

All Scout units that are located in the Dan Beard Council must have local tour permit. All units outside of this council must have a National Tour Permit and present it before taking the hike.

OVERNIGHT CAMP:

Hike-in campsites available at Bethel, night prior to hiking trail. Water is available at campsites. Charcoal recommended for cooking.

POLICY:

The policy of the Trail Committee is to award the medal upon completion of the hike, providing APPLICATION and fee of \$2.50 for each Scout and Scouter has been forwarded, and a 200 word essay on the life of U. S. Grant has been approved by unit leader. Fee of \$2.50 is used to defray expense of medal.

TRAIL OPEN:

From March 1 to November 1.

LENGTH OF TRAIL:

34 miles

ROUTE OF TRAIL:

Trail begins at Grant school house in Georgetown, Ohio and ends at birthplace at Pt. Pleasant, Ohio

MUSEUM FEE:

A fee of \$.15 per person is paid direct to attendant at Birthplace at Point Pleasant to defray expense of museum, which is operated and maintained by Ohio Historical Society.

INSIGNIA:

Trail patch is shaped like State of Ohio and has blue background with Birthplace embroidered in white. Available at \$.50. Additional hiking segment pin will be awarded for those who wish to hike trail second time. Cost \$1.00

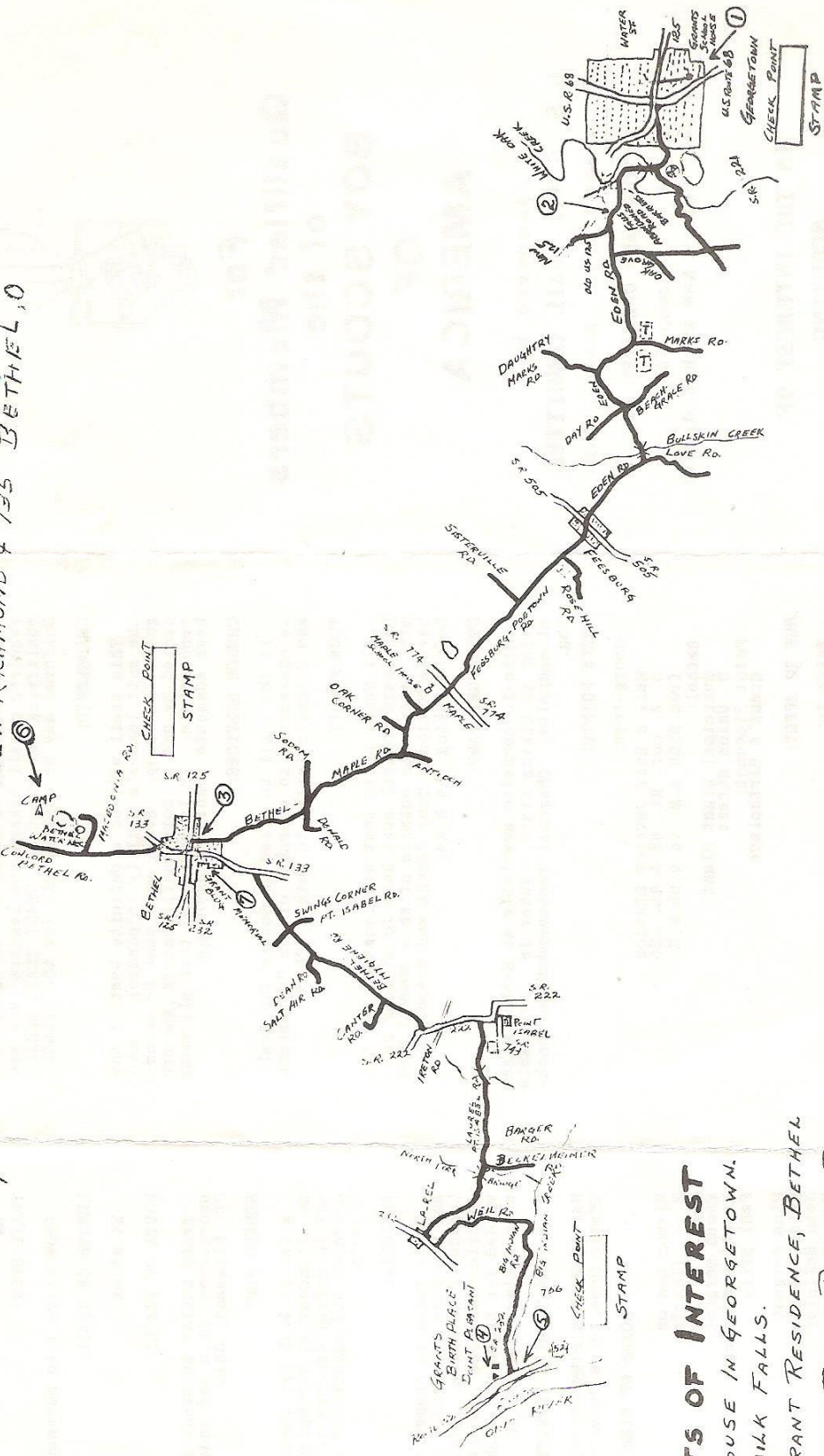
